

RE:START strategy - general overview:

- Created on the initiative of 3 structurally affected regions -> KVR, UR and MSR and a government resolution
- Part of the Regional Development Strategy 2021+
- Since 2017 first strategic framework (based on needs analysis)
- Strategic framework (7 pillars), updates 2020 and 2023
- Action Plan (AP1 -> AP5) specific measures, updates every 2 years
- Strategy has no financial resources of its own used to negotiate specific calls or allocations for the structurally affected regions, possibly for point advantages and generally to promote the interests of the 3 structurally affected regions
- Setting up close cooperation with regions -> formulation of measures and priorities







Social, socio-economic and demographic challenges:

- **Brain drain** (all regions)
- **Depopulation** and aging of population (MSR, KVR, UR)
- Unfavourable educational structure of the population (UR and KVR)
- The highest unemployment rate in CZ all three regions
- High level of executions (seizure) and household indebtedness (UR, KVR)
- Socially excluded localities and rising social inequalities (KVR,UR,+-MSR)
- Low regional image and low attractiveness of regions (MSR, UR)
- Quality of life
- Regional identity historical context (German displacement, UR, KVR)





Just Transition in the Czech Republic with focus on Territorial Just Transition Plan (TJTP)

Areas of support agreed on by coal regions:

- Development of innovative potential and support for business activity
- Transformation of economic sectors affected by coal phase-out
- Reskilling and upskilling
- Research and development, improved education (human resources)
- Land reclamation and revitalisation of post-mining areas (looking for new functions of territory)
- New sources of energy (use of renewable resources) -> mostly Modernisation Fund







Overview on Just Transition Mechanism in CZ Participation in Czech coal regions

Multi-dimensional approach oriented on multiple different stakeholders: public sector (national, regional, local: ministries, regional government, municipalities etc.), private sector: Business, Key Industrial sectors, Employers, Unions, NGOes and many guests in role of observers including representatives of EC

- Transformation Platform
- Online and present meetings informing about the process with room for questions and comments > done by national and regional public institutions
- Dedicated meetings with particular stakeholders
- Spreading information by participating in the events done by NGOs or other partners
- **Dedicated groups** working on specific issues and close communication with representatives of regional governments
- Transparent process programme, meeting minutes and presentations are shared on website <u>DotaceEU Transformační platforma</u>
